ECHO CLASS SPECIFICATIONS 2011

WALK-TROT DIVISION: Open to any jr./am rider. Riders may not cross-enter into any other division at this show.

GSDHJA points awarded in walk-trot (no points for Walk-Trot-Canter). Riders who have competed in classes requiring canter for more than 1 season are not eligible to ride in Walk/Trot.

Walk-Trot Equitation: To be judged at the walk and trot.

Walk-Trot Pleasure: Horse judged on suitability and ease of riding.

Walk-Trot Equitation and Walk-Trot Hunters Over Rails: To be judged at the trot over rails one time around each. In equitation over rails, rider to two point over rails & post the trot in between, with diagonals to count around corners but not between rails.

Walk-Trot Under Saddle: Horses judged on manners and way of going.

Walk-Trot-Canter One Rider at a time: Equitation to be judged.

ECHO Walk-Trot Medal: All entries will work collectively on the flat and will be asked to demonstrate at least 6 of the following skills: walk, posting and/or sitting trot, halt, back. At the halt or walk, drop and retrieve irons. At the walk or trot, circle, reverse, 2 point, change of rein across the diagonal or follow a simple pattern, basic questions of horsemanship.

CROSSRAIL HUNTERS AND EQUITATION: Open to any jr./am rider eligible per GSDHJA rules. Simple changes not to be penalized as a break in gait. Riders may not cross-enter any class or division with fences 2'3" or higher.

Crossrail Hunter Hack: Horses judged under saddle followed by 2 fences.

Crossrail Hunters: Fences 1'0" twice around

Crossrail Hunter Course: Fences 1'0" set in a standard figure 8 hunter course.

Crossrail Equitation Over Fences: Fences 1'0" twice around.

Crossrail Pleasure: Horses judged on suitability and ease of riding at the walk, trot and canter.

Crossrail Equitation: Riders to be judged at the walk, trot and canter.

SHORT/LONG STIRRUP HUNTERS AND EQUITATION: Open to any jr./am rider eligible per GSDHJA rules. GSDHJA points in Short or Long Stirrup. Simple changes not to be penalized as a break in gait. Riders may not cross-enter Pony Hunters or any class or division with fences 2'6" or higher.

Hunters: Fences 2'0" in a standard figure 8 hunter course.

Equitation Over Fences: Fences 2'0" in a simplified equitation course.

Hunters under Saddle: Horses judged at the walk, trot and canter.

Equitation: Riders to be judged at the walk, trot and canter.

GREEN RIDER HUNTERS: Open to any jr./am rider eligible per GSDHJA rules. Riders may not cross-enter into any class or division with fences higher than 2'6". Riders also competing at 2'6" may only enter Green Rider Hunters if they are in their 1st season of showing at 2'6".

Green Rider Hunters: Fences 2'3" in a standard figure 8 hunter course.

Green Rider Hunters under Saddle: Horses judged at the walk, trot and canter.

PONY HUNTERS: Open to all ponies & riders 17 & under. Riders may not cross enter into Short/Long Stirrup, Walk-Trot or Crossrail Hunters.

Pony Hunters: Fences 2'3" in a standard figure 8 hunter course.

Pony Hunters under Saddle: Horses judged on manners and way of going at the walk, trot and canter.

2'6" HUNTERS: Open to any rider, any age. GSDHJA points awarded in Baby Green Hunters OR Low Children's OR Low Adult Amateur Hunters. Riders may not cross-enter into any class or division with fences lower than 2'3".

2'6" Hunters: Fences 2'6" in a standard figure 8 hunter course.

2'6" Handy Hunters: Fences 2'6" may include broken lines and a trot fence.

2'6" Hunters under Saddle: Horses judged on manners and way of going at the walk, trot and canter.

2'9" HUNTERS: Open to any rider, any age. GSDHJA points awarded in Children's Hunters OR A/A Hunters OR Pre-Green Hunters. Riders may not cross-enter into any class or division with fences lower than 2'6" except Pony Hunters, Training Hunters and Schooling Jumpers.

2'9" Hunters: Fences 2'9" in a standard figure 8 hunter course.

2'9" Handy Hunters: Fences 2'9" may include broken lines and a trot fence.

2'9" Hunters under Saddle: Horses to be judged at the walk, trot and canter.

3' HUNTERS: Open to any jr./am rider eligible per GSDHJA rules. Riders may not cross-enter into any hunter or eq. class or division with fences lower than 2'9". GSDHJA points awarded in Modified Jr./AM Hunters OR Low Hunters.

3' Hunters: Fences 3' in a standard figure 8 hunter course.

3' Hunters under Saddle: Horses judged at the walk, trot and canter.

RUSTY STIRRUP CROSSRAIL HUNTERS AND EQUITATION: Open to any Amateur Rider age 40 or older who has not shows at 2'6" or higher. Simple changes not to be penalized as a break in gait. Riders may not cross-enter any class or division with fences 2'3" or higher.

Rusty Stirrup Crossrail Hunters: Fences 1'0" twice around

Rusty Stirrup Crossrail Pleasure: Horses judged on suitability and ease of riding at the walk, trot and canter.

Rusty Stirrup Crossrail Equitation: Riders to be judged at the walk, trot and canter.

EQUITATION DIVISION: Open to any jr./am rider eligible per GSDHJA rules. Champion and Reserve to riders with greatest # of total points in Age Group, Open and 1 Over Fences class. (Walk-trot does not count toward determining maiden, novice or limit status.)

Maiden Equitation: Open to riders who have not won a blue ribbon in equitation or medals at a GSDHJA, PCHA, OSCHA, or USEF recognized show.

Novice Equitation: Open to riders who have not won 3 or more blue ribbons in equitation or medals.

Limit Equitation: Open to riders who have not won 6 or more blue ribbons in equitation or medals.

Open Equitation: Open to all riders 17 & under and Amateurs 18 & over. GSDHJA points awarded in rider's age group.

Age Group Flat Equitation: GSDHJA points awarded in rider's age group.

2'3" Equitation over Fences: GSDHJA points awarded in Equitation 11 and under. Riders older than 11 may not cross-enter any class or division with fences higher than 2'6".

2'6" Equitation over Fences: GSDHJA points awarded in Equitation 12-13. Riders may not cross-enter any class or division with fences lower than 2'3".

2'9" Equitation over Fences: GSDHJA points awarded in Equitation 14-17 OR 18 & Over. Riders may not cross-enter any class or division with fences lower than 2'6" except Training Hunters and Mini Jumper Stake.

PLEASURE:** Open to any horse/ rider. Judged on manners, suitability and ease of riding at the walk, trot and canter.

GSDHJA MEDALS: Open to GSDHJA Junior and Amateur members only. At least 3 must enter to fill.

Green Rider Medal: All entries to jump a medal-type course of fences 2'3", including at least two changes of direction. A work off is at the judge's discretion. Riders may not cross-enter any class with fences higher than 2'6".

GSDHJA Mini Medal: All entries to jump a medal-type course of fences 2'6", including at least two changes of direction and will include 2 tests (#1-7). No work off. Riders may not cross-enter any class with fences lower than 2'3" except Training Hunters and Schooling Jumpers.

GSDHJA Flat Medal: All entries will work collectively on the flat and will be asked to demonstrate at least 6 of the following advanced flat work skills: lengthening and/or collection of stride, counter canter, turn on the haunches, turn on the forehand, work without irons and/or other tests deemed appropriate by the judge.

GSDHJA Adult Amateur Medal: All entries to jump a medal type course of fences 2'9", and include at least two changes of direction. Additional testing or work-off is at the judge's discretion. Riders may not cross-enter any class with fences lower than 2'6" except Training Hunters and Schooling Jumpers.

GSDHJA Medal: All entries to jump a medal-type course of fences 3', including at least two changes of direction. A work off of at least the top 4 riders is mandatory. Riders may not cross-enter any other medals over fences at the same show. Riders may not cross-enter any class with fences lower than 2'9" except Training Hunters and Jumpers.

SCHOOLING JUMPERS: Fences 2'3", 2'6" and 2'9". Open to any horse any rider except for riders in Walk-Trot and Crossrails. Ribbons to 6th place.

LOW CHILDREN'S/ADULT AMATEUR JUMPERS: To jump fences 2'6" with up to a 2'6" spread. Open to all junior & adult amateur riders except for riders in Walk-Trot, Crossrails and Short/Long Stirrup..

CHILDREN'S/ADULT AMATEUR JUMPERS: To jump fences 2'9" with up to a 2'9" spread. Open to all junior & adult amateur riders showing at 2'6" or above.

ALL JUMPERS: Round 1 under USEF Jumper Rules JP145 - Table II Section 2 (a). Jump off for first place tie only. Round 2 under USEF Jumper Rules JP145 - Table II Section 2 (b). At least 3 must enter to fill. Two refusals disqualify.

TRAINING HUNTERS: Fences 2'-2'3". Open to any horse any rider except for riders in Walk-Trot and Crossrails. Ribbons to 6th

SCHOOLING HUNTERS: Fences 2'6". Open to any horse any rider. Each horse/rider combination is allowed 1 round. Additional rounds available if time allows. Not judged.

** Clinic attire acceptable. For complete rules, visit the entry booth or www.echohorseshow.com.

All ECHO classes are run in accordance with GSDHJA class specifications, eligibility and cross entry restrictions. For more information go to www.gsdhja.org.

RULES

- 1. MANAGEMENT:** The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of or incident to the Show without claims for damage or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in the rules and regulations or class specifications shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, whose decision is final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to refuse, to accept conditionally, or to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, to reschedule classes, and to change rings or judges.
- 2. ENTRY AGREEMENT:** Every entry shall constitute an agreement that the person making it, owner, lessee, trainer, manager, coach, rider and the horse 1) shall be subject to the local rules of the show; 2) that every horse and/or rider is eligible as entered; 3) that the owner and any of its representatives are bound by the rules of the show and will accept as final the decision of the show management on any question arising under said rules and agree to hold the show, their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken; 4) that the owner, rider and any of their agents or representatives agree to hold the show and its officials, directors, employees and agents harmless for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the show, whether or not such injury or loss resulted directly or indirectly from negligent acts of said officials, show management, employees or volunteers. I agree to indemnify and save harmless the ECHO Horse Show Organization and Heartland Ranch., and singular any directors, officers, member, employees and agents thereof from and against any and all loss, costs or expenses, or any claim thereof, of whatever nature arising or to arise, for and on account, or by reason of the entry or entries hereby made.
- 3. ADDS/SCRATCHES:** Before a class begins it may be **added** without additional charge, or **scratched** with full refund. **After the class begins, no adds allowed and no refund will be given for scratches. Management reserves the right to charge a fee for excessive adds or scratches.**
- 4. RDNE: Rode did not enter.** A fee of \$10 will be charged for any class in which an exhibitor competes without entering before the start of the class.
- 5. CROSS ENTRY:** It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to know the rules and class specifications. In the case of a violation of an ECHO or GSDHJA cross entry restriction, the entry fee and any class placing and/or prize will be forfeited. *All ECHO classes are run in accordance with GSDHJA class specifications, eligibility and cross entry restrictions. For more information go to www.gsdhja.org.*
- 6. NON-NEGOTIABLE CHECKS:** Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be assessed a penalty of \$25.00 plus any bank charges incurred. Upon notification of a returned check accounts must be paid within 10 days. GSDHJA and all local show managers will be notified of exhibitors with unresolved returned checks.
- 7. BILLING:** Any unpaid entries from the show that have to be billed for payment following the show will be subject to an additional \$25 charge unless prior arrangements have been made.
- 8. SCHEDULING: Ring 1:** The first 2 classes of all hunter divisions will run with 2 open cards. Horses will rotate in groups of 4 through both rounds before going to the next group. Please sign up with the announcer for a spot in the order before the class starts. **Ring 2:** Begins promptly at 7:45 with hunter hack. All entered must be in the ring at 7:45.

It is the intention of the management to avoid holding rings to wait for exhibitors or trainers. In the event of a ring conflict, please inform the gate in each ring so that we can best arrange the schedule. Each trainer and exhibitor has the responsibility to keep track of the progress of the show. Although we make every effort to announce reasonable calls for classes, announcements can not always be heard in all areas of the parking lot. We apologize for any inconvenience. There are no refunds for missed classes.
- 9. MEDAL CLASSES:** All medal classes will run with a drawn order of go which will be posted no less than 15 minutes before the start of the class. Last minute entries will go at the top of the order. Riders must be members of GSDHJA to compete in a GSDHJA medal.
- 10. GSDHJA POINTS ASSIGNMENT:** A competitor who wishes to insure proper assignment of GSDHJA points must complete a GSDHJA declaration form. Forms will be available at the entry booth.
- 11. ON CALL VETERINARIAN:** For emergencies - East County Large Animal Practice. (619) 561-4661. Please be prepared to pay at time of service.
- 12. DOGS:** Dogs are a serious health and safety issue and must be leashed and under control at all times. Violators will be asked to leave.
- 13. ALCOHOL:** No alcohol is permitted on the show grounds.
- 14. NUMBERS:** Horses are required to have their correct horse show entry # attached whenever they are exhibiting or warming up.
- 15. PARKING/MOTORIZED VEHICLES:** All vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas. Access roads are for ingress and egress only. No vehicles may be parked in the vicinity of the entry booth. All cars must park in a designated location separate from horse trailers. Unlicensed drivers may not operate any motor vehicle, including golf carts, on the show grounds.
- 16. QUESTIONS/PROTESTS:** ECHO's mission is to educate riders and parents new to showing. Feel free to ask any question of any staff member. All protests and questions for the judge must go through the show manager. The decision of management is final.
- 17. CLASS SPECIFICATIONS:** For complete specifications please refer to Class Specifications, available at the entry booth or at www.echohorseshow.com
- 18. ATTIRE:** It is the tradition of the sport that riders be correctly attired for the class in question. This includes hunt coat, breeches and boots with a distinguishable heel. Dirty, ill-fitting or inappropriate attire indicates a lack of respect for the sport. Penalty is at the judge's discretion. ** Pleasure, Walk-Trot hunter under saddle, pleasure and hunters over rails classes do not require hunt counts or tall boots, clinic attire (helmet, polo, boots and breeches or jodhpurs) is acceptable.
- 19. HELMETS:** All junior riders must wear properly fitted protective headgear, with harness secured, while mounted. All riders jumping any obstacle of any size must wear properly fitted protective headgear with harness secured.
